Oakdale Electric Cooperative was proud to sponsor two youth members to attend the 50<sup>th</sup> Annual NRECA Youth Tour in Washington, D.C., June 13–19, 2014. Trystan Houzner and Sydney Scott were elected by their peers onto the Wisconsin Youth Board at the 2013 Youth Leadership Congress at the University of Wisconsin–River Falls, thus making them eligible to attend the Youth Tour. Funding for the trip was provided by the Federated Youth Fund, which receives monies from unclaimed and returned capital credits.
